- You, the Rainbows then painted for us the things you found that you thought were special. This was the starting point for our Welcome banner. They showed their love, their welcome for all, their creativity through these glorious colourful images you see here.
- I planned to make these images into a banner but found that I ran out of time, life got in the way!
- Our friends from the Grindon Church Community
 Project have a sewing group who very kindly
 volunteered to make the Welcome banner up for us.
 For me this offer and the work it entailed showed their
 love, their creativity and skill.
- Then a Church member, Raine, gave freely of his time to ensure the Welcome banner can be put in its place straight after this blessing this evening.
- This Welcome banner will then share all of our welcomes to all of those who come through the glass doors or use the space in this amazing building.
- You will be able to see it every time you come to Rainbows and remind your family and friends you helped to make this special thing happen, thank you!

Following the destruction of the Nova Kakhovka dam on 6 June and the resulting floods, Christian Aid is renewing its Ukraine appeal. The destruction led to the flooding of 37 towns and villages and 16,000 people leaving their homes. One of Europe's largest reservoirs is also now drying up leading the UN to announce that drinking water supplies could be affected for more than 700,000 people, mostly in Russian-occupied areas.
